Congratulations once again to PEI Crime Stoppers for continuing their good work for 2021, in producing their Annual Awareness Guide. Since the program began on PEI in 1989, well over 950 arrests have been recorded along with over 600 charges laid as a result of over 10,500 tips received, and 3.25 million dollars in cash, stolen property and drugs seized along with over 1300 cases cleared. This program is yet once again one of the greatest crime-fighting resources law enforcement has at its disposal, and it must remain as an integral component in assisting in solving crime. Crime Stoppers helps to reduce crime and the fear of crime in homes, schools, businesses, and communities. Crime Stoppers assists law enforcement in generating leads on cold cases, new investigations, details on current high-profile cases, and locations of individuals with outstanding warrants. The tip information provided to law enforcement officers and investigators help solve cases that would not have been solved otherwise, such as hit & runs, robberies, B & E's, narcotic offences, arsons, and many other crimes.

Crime Stoppers is a civilian, non-for-profit, charitable organization that brings together three entities in a relationship, the police services of a community, the media and the community in the fight against crime.

Crime Stoppers recognizes that often the men and women of law enforcement go above and beyond to make PEI a better and safer province to work and raise a family. The success of Crime Stoppers is based on the partnership between law enforcement, the media and the citizens of Prince Edward Island. There is no doubt that all law enforcement officers work diligently to ensure the safety and well-being of our communities, often contributing to the communities they serve in ways that shows their true commitment to serving the public.

Crime Stoppers provides citizens with a vehicle to anonymously supply the police with information about a crime, or potential crime of which they have knowledge. Crime Stoppers as an independent charity, are not part of the police and simply act as a route for members of the public to speak out about issues that affect their communities. A reward of up to \$2,000 is offered up to anyone providing information which leads to an arrest for a crime. Rewards may also be made for information leading to the recovery of stolen property, the seizure of illegal drugs or an arrest on an outstanding warrant.

A volunteer board of Directors actively administers and is responsible for the program. Like mentioned, Crime Stoppers is a non-profit charitable organization and is responsible for raising funds and the disbursements of rewards. The Board of Directors work in close cooperation with police agencies and all areas of the media and contributions from individuals, corporations, professional associations, retailers, civic and social groups keep the Crime Stoppers program functional.

Police services across the Island strongly support Crime Stoppers as do government agencies with enforcement responsibilities. The coordinator is responsible for the tips line, media releases, liaising with the Board of Directors and maintaining a rapport with enforcement agencies. The community component (the Board) is responsible for program policy, fund-raising, promotions, development of short and long- term planning along with keeping financial records.

It is imperative that all police agencies partner with Crime Stoppers and the media so the program can help officers solve crimes as the media is a very important component of Crime Stoppers. An unsolved crime can be re-enacted and shown on television, social media, or may be publicized in a newspaper or aired on radio so the media brings the program to the attention of the public. Finally, citizens must play an active role in community safety by coming forward anonymously with information in relation to crimes. Summerside Police Services have an ongoing commitment to continue to support Crime Stoppers and its programs, and we will continue to do so in the future.

Thank you and congratulations once again to the Board of Directors on another successful year. We certainly look forward to hearing about your continued success in helping to keep communities safe across our great province.

Mischief - Head of Cardigan, PEI

Kings District RCMP are investigating a mischief complaint that happened to a community mailbox on Nicholson Road in Head of Cardigan. The suspect(s) damaged the locks on two mailboxes and gained entry to them. The mischief is believed to have happened on February 2, 2021.

Theft of Tools - Head of Cardigan, PEI

The Kings District RCMP are seeking the assistance from the public. They are investigating the theft of a CD player and various tools valued between \$200.00 and \$300.00 that were stolen from a truck on the 48 Road in Head of Cardigan. This theft occurred sometime in early or mid-January. There has been a number of thefts lately in that area (Cardigan, Elliotvale and Head of Cardigan).

Damage to Property - Georgetown, PEI

Kings District RCMP are seeking the public's assistance in identifying the individual(s) responsible for substantial lawn damage at the Town of Georgetown well, where the grass was ripped up from vehicles.



Arson - Truck and Trees - Head of Hillsborough, PEI

The Kings District RCMP are seeking the assistance from the public. They are investigating an Arson that occurred on a private property off Barr Road in Head of Hillsborough. The suspect(s) entered a privately-owned wood lot by cutting a preform cable used to block the entrance. They accessed the property where they completely burnt a 2008 Ford Ranger, connecting nearby trees and wood. The Arson is believed to have happened between November 8 - 15, 2020.



Break and Enter - Theft of Generator & Trail Camera - Gaspereaux, PEI

Kings District RCMP are investigating a Break and Enter into a property located on Route 17 in Gaspereaux that occurred sometime between September 16 - 24, 2020. The person(s) responsible stole a generator and a trail camera from an outbuilding on the property.

• The generator is a King KCG - 1000, red in colour. • The make or model of the trail camera is unknown but is camo coloured.

Theft of Tools - Belle River, PEI

Theft of Pleasure Craft and Generators - Brudenell, PEI

Kings District RCMP are investigating the theft of a 2012 Sea-Ray Sundancer 260 pleasure craft, a Mechron Engineering Products industrial standby generator (fixed-mount) and a Champion 7,000-watt portable generator (yellow with wheels). The boat and generators were stored in a large barn on the Brudenell Point Road in Brudenell. The theft likely occurred between 5:00 p.m. on December 21, 2019 and sometime in the morning of December 22, 2019.



Damage to Property - Murray River, PEI

The Kings District RCMP are seeking the assistance from the public. They are investigating damage to a home in Murray River. The incident occurred sometime between Thursday, July 23, 2020 and Saturday, July 25, 2020. The individual(s) came onto the property and attempted to break into the residence. A large window was broken and the window screens were cut.

Theft of Stop Signs – Montague, PEI

Kings District RCMP in Montague are investigating the theft of several stop signs from Brook St., Patrick St., Sackville St. and Central St. in Montague in July 2020, and are looking for any assistance or information the public may be able to provide. Protecting yourself from Scams and Fraud



Cold Case / Suspicious Death 2015

On April 12th 2015 the RCMP's Major Crime Unit in Prince Edward Island entered into an investigation relating to the discovery of a deceased infant child found near the Birch Hill Free Church of Scotland in Mount Albion. Over the past five years countless avenues of investigation have been pursued and tips followed up, with negative results. Numerous tips came in, and were followed up. None of these tips led to any viable suspects.

Over the course of the investigation the RCMP have released pieces of the investigation to the public in hopes of obtaining additional information on the death. COLD CASE: HOMICIDE

BYRON CARR Murdered 11 November 1988

Byron Carr, 1988

Byron Carr was last seen alive at approximately 3:30 a.m. on Friday, November 11, 1988, which was the beginning of a long Remembrance Day weekend. He was driving a 1987 white Ford Tempo westward on Sydney Street near the corner of Great George Street, Charlottetown. Thirty-one hours later, he was found dead in the bedroom of his home at 24 Lapthorne Avenue, Charlottetown. Time of death was determined to be between 3:30-9:00 a.m. on November 11th. Evidence at the scene indicated that his death followed a sexual act with a male. Carr was strangled and stabbed, and the killer left a note saying "I WILL KILL AGAIN!" Investigators are interested in speaking to anyone who may have been on city streets at that time. No matter how insignificant your information may seem to you, it may be important to investigators. Remember,

"Crime Stoppers is not about telling on people ... it is about protecting your family, your home and your community!"



1. Releasing the photo is another step in the investigation.

2. The message was located on a wall within the victim's residence and is believed to be have been left by the person responsible for the death of Byron Carr.

3. The message has been examined by experts in the field of handwriting and printing analysis, however, we hope that by releasing it to the public, someone may recognize the characteristics or style of the print letters within the message and be able to associate them to a person.




